Hooking in June!

Trent School of Rug Hooking is offering 7 classes taught by well qualified instructors. During the week students will receive 30 hours of instruction, enjoy a well stocked Hookers' Boutique and be inspired by the rug display at Trent University. Accommodation and meals are available on campus.

Trent School of Rug Hooking is held at Trent University main campus which is located at the north end of Peterborough along the Otonabee River. We will use facilities at: Lady Eaton College (west side of the river) and Otonabee College (east side of the river). All buildings on campus are smoke free.

*We are pleased to offer **The Hooking Room** as a chance to relax and hook on an unfinished project. The tuition fee for this class will be \$ 100.00 as there is no instructor.*

Classes: Classes begin Sunday evening from 7:00 - 9:30pm, Monday to Friday from **9:00am to 3:30pm** at Otonabee College with one hour for lunch. This building is equipped with ramps and fully air-conditioned. The walk between the Lady Eaton College and Otonabee College is approximately 5 minutes.

Accommodations: Residence will have bedding and towels provided. Your accommodation fee includes 6 nights and meals from Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast. Students staying on campus have a choice between the residence at Lady Eaton College and Gzowski College.

Lady Eaton: Each room has a single bed and access to shared bathroom areas.

Gzowski Building: Each room has a double bed with private access to a shared bathroom with the next room. This building is air-conditioned and equipped with elevators for your convenience.

Courses for 2010

Hooking with Alternative Fibres

Come and explore the endless possibilities of using alternative fibres. Learn how to recycle any type of fibre into a hooked matt or wall hanging. Use your imagination and create a design based on the fibres provided. This course is excellent for anyone who has a wool allergy and also for anyone who is interested in the recycling aspect of hooking. Beginner hookers will enjoy this course but even the "well seasoned hooker" will enjoy trying something new.

"Creativity" from A - Z

Have you wanted to choose a new pattern to hook, perhaps using a different colour palette? Maybe even using another hooking technique, or incorporating embellishment in a project? Then this non theme class is for you. Each participant will work on a pattern of their own choosing using hooking styles that could be primitive, wide cut, or fine cut. The shared learning from all the different projects will serve as an extra benefit to all. Creativity will be emphasized.

Dabbling and Dipping in the Dye Pot

Is DYEING for the art of rug hooking a mystery to you? If the answer is yes, come and join Laura for this informative and fun-filled week. The course is designed for the beginning rug hooker with no dyeing experience as well as the rug hooker who wishes a refresher course on current trends. The student will have an opportunity to compare and contrast three types of acid dyes used by rug hookers in controlled experiments as well as working with their own materials in a less structured environment. Colour theory will be discussed and procedure to promote health and safety in handling the dyes will be emphasized. Working in teams of three or individually, twelve different methods of dyeing will be undertaken, with one full day spent on 'primitive' dyeing techniques.

Pictorials

Students may select a commercial pattern or a pictorial picture which has personal meaning to them. A good visual aid or snapshot is essential to what you will be hooking. Instruction will be given on trees, grass, water, sky, buildings and other important items appearing in a pictorial. How to hook and use colour in the Four Seasons will also be discussed as well as the layering of wool to create depth. You may hook your pictorial in a #3 to a #6 cut. Prerequisite—students must have taken a basic shading course.

Geometric

In this class we will focus on the use of colour and lines to create an exceptional geometric rug or wall hanging. We will discuss how to create optical illusions in your geometrics. You may wish to design your own rug (remembering the copyright issue) or use a commercial pattern. We will discuss designing geometrics during the week and paper will be available for you to practice your design skills.

Purely Primitive

Come to this class with thoughts of authentic old rugs in mind. You will leave with a completed design and a good start on your authentic, old looking rug. Several methods of finishing will be demonstrated, accompanied by notes. Old colours will be investigated and we will work on a colour plan to suit you. I will provide many sources for patterns and designs. You will bring your enthusiasm ...what a team!

Oriental

As a long time student of Dorothy Haight, Vera has developed a passion for Orientals. In this class you will become familiar with the terms, motifs and history of Oriental design. Come and immerse yourself in this wonderful topic.

The Hooking Room

No instructor

In this class, students will work on their own projects while being encouraged by their classmates.

Option A: Resident at Lady Eaton College

Private room accommodation and tuition for school.

\$630.00 (accommodation fee) + 100.00 (tuition fee) = \$730.00 The Hooking Room

Option C: Commuter

Tuition for school and commuter fee

\$190.00 (tuition fee) + 65.00 (commuter fee) = \$255.00

\$100.00 (tuition fee) + 65.00 (commuter fee) = \$165.00 The Hooking Room

Note: The accommodation fee includes meals from Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast, lodging, use of facilities, parking, and staff gratuities, morning breaks, 8% PST and 5% GST.

The commuter fee covers the use of the facilities, morning breaks, the parking pass and applicable taxes.
