Hooking in June!

Trent School of Rug Hooking is offering 7 classes taught by well qualified instructors. During the week students will receive 30 hours of instruction, enjoy a well stocked Hookers' Boutique and be inspired by the rug display at Trent University. Accommodation and meals are available on campus.

Trent School of Rug Hooking is held at Trent University main campus which is located at the north end of Peterborough along the Otonabee River. We will use facilities at: Lady Eaton College (west side of the river) and Otonabee College (east side of the river). All buildings on campus are smoke free.

Classes: Classes begin Sunday evening from 7:00 - 9:30pm, Monday to Friday from **9:00am to 3:30pm** at Otonabee College with one hour for lunch. This building is equipped with ramps and fully air conditioned. The walk between the Lady Eaton College and Otonabee College is approximately 5 minutes.

Accommodation fee includes **all meals** from Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast, **lodging**, use of facilities, parking, and staff gratuities, morning breaks, 13% HST.

Accommodations: Residence will have bedding and towels provided. Students staying on campus have a choice between the residence at Lady Eaton College and Gzowski College.

Lady Eaton: Each room has a single bed and access to shared bathroom areas.

Gzowski Building: Each room has a double bed with private access to a shared bathroom with the next room. This building is air-conditioned and equipped with elevators for your convenience.

Courses for 2012

Open Class

Jeanne will be teaching an open class. Her specialties are Orientals, antique look, pictorials of all size cuts, and folk art. She has been McGown certified since 1979, having begun hooking in 1971. Jeanne teaches at several events each year and owns new earth designs. A catalogue is available for ordering through her website www.newearthdesigns.com She loves to dye, and has a loyal following for her hand dyed wools. Patterns and wool will be available at rug school. For this class, you are welcome to work on any commercial pattern, or an original design of your own. Adaptations or copies of others artwork must have permission granted paperwork. She encourages good pre rug school communication and advance planning to maximize your time in class

Turning Over a New Leaf

Are the leaves in your rug hooking projects lacking pizzazz? Learn how to design for and hook a selection of different shaped leaves on a rug or wall hanging. Using templates provided by Laura, the students will be encouraged to create their own patterns or personalize a commercial design. Then, using a variety of wools including swatches, dip dye, painting on wool, casserole and spot dyeing, step-by-step instructions will take the rug hooker from start to finish for this project and beyond. A basic knowledge of shading would be helpful.

“Memories” of Houses, Buildings, Cottages, Historical Buildings and/or Architectural Details

Do you have a favourite building you took a picture of from a holiday or your family home/cottage or does your interest lie in DOORS, WINDOWS, and OR WROUGHT IRON DETAIL or an ARCHITECTURAL DETAIL from stone or other.

Wide and/or narrow cuts work well. Assistance prior to class regarding the pattern and materials will be available. Class members should have prior experience in rug hooking.

Jacobean Crewel

In this class you will learn the basic fancy stitches that are used in Jacobean crewel – reverse, chain stitch, seed stitch, sculpture, turkey work, single and double French knots. You can work on a commercial pattern of your choice and the size of your motifs will determine the width of cut you can use, #3 to #6 cut. Using swatches or dip dyeing will also depend on the style and size of your motifs.

Nylons: Explosion of Colour

Discover the world of colours to bring your own design to life. Uncover the vivid display in any your choice of pattern. It could be as a geometric, a pictorial or a primitive design. Sources for such could be quilting magazines, favourite photos or ancient rugs. Nylon rugs hooked on verel are washable, practical and fun to hook. They will enhance [adorn] your home with gorgeous colour on a daily basis, as you can see from these examples.

Ontario Fraktur

Beatrice Grant

In the 1700's many Mennonite families travelled from Pennsylvania to the north shore of Lake Ontario, establishing settlements at Niagara, Waterloo and Markham. Among the customs they brought was intricately designed and coloured documents called “*frakturs*”.

This course will feature the works of Anna Weber 1814 – 1888, whose watercolours and rugs were in a more naïve style. With this as inspiration we will design a rug based on fantasy rendered horses, birds and flowers found in her creations of bookplates, painted paper work and rugs. The colours Anna used were clear and delightful. It is possible through symbolism to create your family tree. This course will appeal to those who work in wide cuts or fine cuts.

The Hooking Room

No instructor

In this class, students will work on their own projects while being encouraged by their classmates.

Option C: Commuter

Tuition for school and commuter fee

\$190.00 (tuition fee) + 65.00 (commuter fee) = \$255.00

\$100.00 (tuition fee) + 65.00 (commuter fee) = \$165.00 The Hooking Room

Note: The **accommodation fee** includes **all meals** from Sunday dinner through Saturday breakfast, **lodging**, and use of facilities, parking, and staff gratuities, morning breaks, 13% HST.

The **commuter fee** covers the use of the facilities, morning breaks, the parking pass and applicable taxes.
